Directions for Making Book Bags from T-shirts

- 1. Turn the shirt **inside out**. Cut sleeves from the shirt, being sure to leave the serged seam. The serged seam attaches the sleeve to the body of the T-shirt. Because it is a reinforced seam, it is stronger. We want to keep that seam so the book bag will be stronger.
- 2. If the T-shirt has a **wide neck** or a **V-neck**, no need to cut the neck.

If the T-shirt has a **round, narrow** neck, remove the neck band by cutting around the band.

If the T-shirt is a "muscle shirt," (it is sleeveless), no neck cutting is required.

- 3. Stitch the bottom together. Restitch.
- 4. Turn the shirt right side out. It's now ready to hold books.
- 5. If you have Literacy ConneXus labels, sew a label somewhere on the bag. You may want to first press the label on the bag with a hot iron; then stitch the label in place.
